Wilson stated, "While the AODA only affects new construction or major renovations, many private and public organizations want to avoid the financial or reputational liability of not being able to provide an accessible environment or even worse, a property that poses the potential of physical harm."

"Despite the complexity associated with ensuring accessibility, forward-thinking organizations are already looking at how to become completely barrier free, believing it to be the right thing to do as opposed to just another cost of doing business," Wilson noted. "Many of these organizations look to the expertise of ADC to guide them through the planning and construction phases."

In Canada there is an increased demand for accessibility-focused renovations in the residential market for Canadians who are caring for loved ones with disabilities or want to age at home rather than in a

private or government facility. Right now consumers have to achieve their goals using multiple sources. ADC's mission is to make it easy by giving consumers a single place to get everything they need to make their home accessible, safe and enjoyable.
