WHEN: Friday, September 12, 2008 at 9:00 am

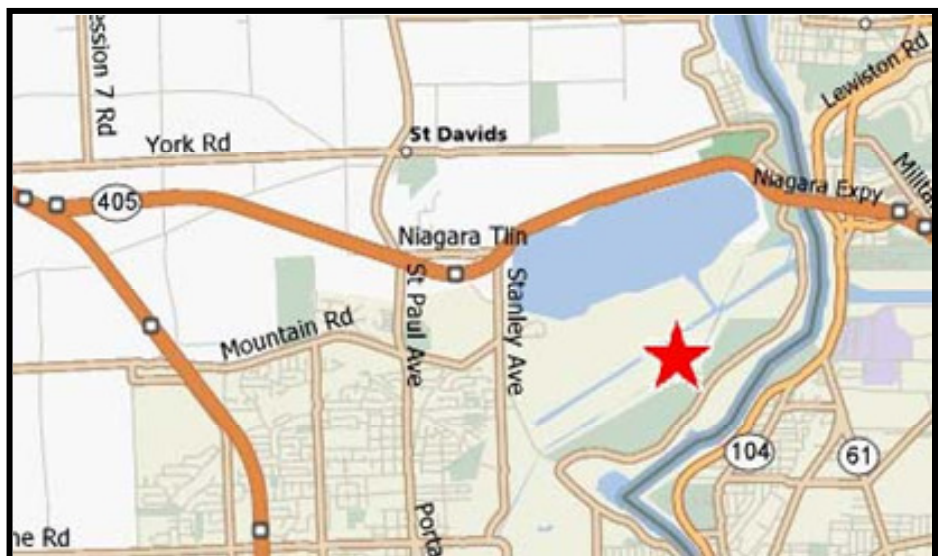

Take exit 37 onto the 405 which continues east where the QEW heads south east. The last exit before the border with the States takes you into Queenston. Turn right (south) onto the Niagara Parkway.)
